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II. Care Partner Support Groups

Care partner support groups create a safe, confidential, supportive environment or community and a chance for participants to develop informal mutual support and social relationships. They also educate and inform participants about dementia and help participants develop methods and skills to solve problems. They typically meet monthly, either in-person or through the use of electronic means.

Care partner support groups are continuously being organized, so if those listed below do not meet your needs, check with the Alzheimer’s Association’s 24/7 Helpline at (800) 272-3900. Directions for using their online Community Resource Finder can be found in Appendix 2.

AgeGuide AgeGuide provides kits in rolling suitcases, containing books, music, games and other items. Kits are available free of charge to community organizations, care facilities and caregivers and can be checked out for a month at time.

"Tales and Travel Memories" is a one-hour program that takes individuals diagnosed with dementia on an imaginary trip to another country utilizing books, music, artifacts, folktales and interesting facts about each destination. Destinations include Central America, Canada, Japan and Mexico.

Music & Memory/Alive Inside is an inter-generational program partnering with volunteer high school students who conduct interviews with participants and deliver a playlist of songs based on the participants interests and feedback from the interview. Personalized music can activate cognition, boost spirits, decrease pain, brighten moods, provide respite, and have many other positive impacts on people living with cognitive challenges.

The *Good Memories Choir* is an 8 week sing along program for people living with Alzheimer's or another dementia and their caregivers. No musical experience or training is needed.

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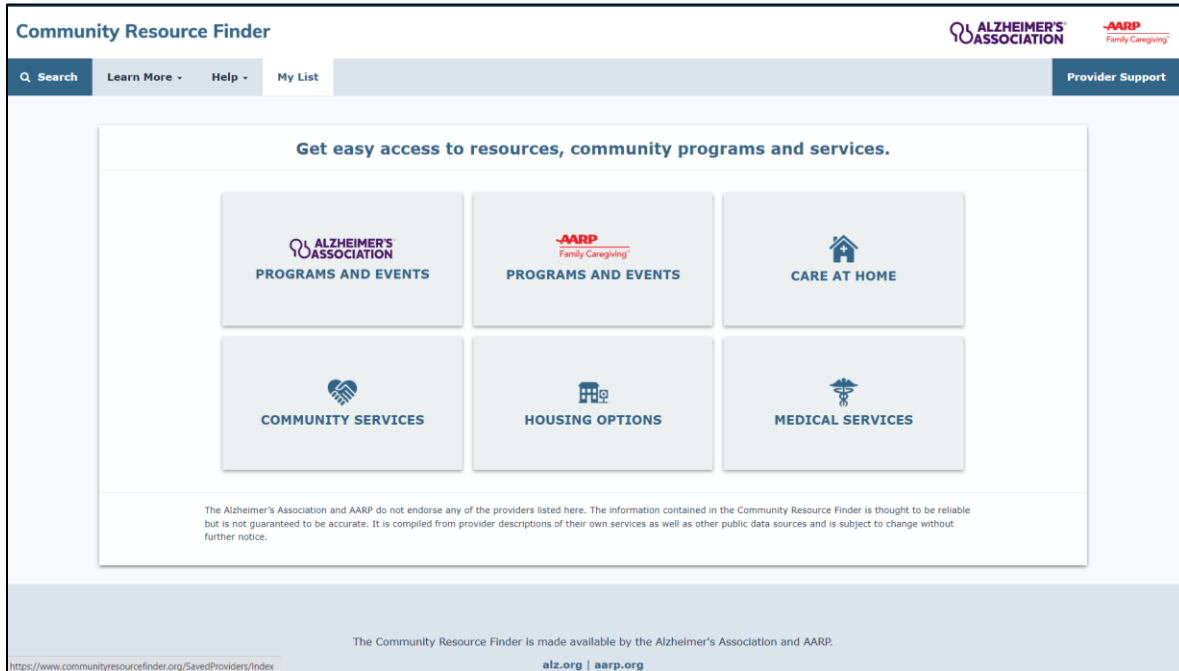

Use the Alzheimer's Association's Community Resource Finder to locate additional dementia support groups in your area.

1. Go to www.communityresourcefinder.org. This screen will appear. Click on **Programs and Events**.



2. On the following screen, select **Alzheimer's Support Groups**. Below this type in your ZIP code (see the example below). Then click on the **SEARCH** button. This will bring up a list of all dementia support groups in your area. To find a group in a specific city or town, enter the name of the city or a ZIP code if you have it; specify a radius of 5 miles.
