



# 2024 Crime and Incident Data

The Naperville Police Department recognizes that awareness is a key factor in the overall safety of a community. Residents who are aware of the types of crimes happening in their city are more likely to practice situational awareness, report suspicious activity to police, and take proactive steps to avoid victimization. For that reason, the Naperville Police Department presents the following overview of crime and incident data reported between Jan. 1 and Dec. 31, 2024.

## Crimes Against Persons

Crimes against persons made up approximately one-quarter of the total crimes reported in Naperville in 2024. The vast majority (more than 91%) of the reported crimes against persons fell into the categories of intimidation and simple assault. Simple assault includes altercations and incidents (including domestics) that don't involve weapons or serious injuries. Here are a few take-aways from the 2024 statistics:

- There was one homicide in Naperville in 2024. This was a domestic incident that occurred in a residence on the 2500 block of Saddlebrook Drive in July 2024.
- The total number of crimes against persons is down slightly compared to 2023.
- A total of 36 criminal sexual assaults were reported to police in 2024. While it does not minimize the seriousness of this crime, we feel it is important for the community to know that in the majority (33) of these cases, the victims knew or were somehow acquainted with the offender. Of the remaining three cases, one involved a victim who was assaulted by someone they had just met that evening and two involved victims who would not disclose any information about the incidents.
- Domestic batteries make up approximately 64% of all simple assaults reported to NPD. *If you are a victim of domestic violence, please know that help is available. ## Crimes Against Property

The majority (approximately 64%) of Naperville's reported crime in 2024 is classified as property crimes, most of which are theft, fraud, and vandalism. Here are a few take-aways from the 2024 statistics:

- Overall, property crime in 2024 was down approximately 4% compared to 2023.
- Theft made up nearly half of all property crimes reported, with the number of reported shoplifting offenses increasing in each of the last two years.
- Reported incidents of burglary to motor vehicle and motor vehicle theft increased slightly in 2024, with 77% of burglaries to vehicles involving unlocked vehicles.
- Overall, fraud cases decreased in each of the last two years. However, the amount of money residents reportedly lost to scams in 2024 totaled nearly \$5.5 million. Victims ranged in age from 15 to 91 and most frequently reported social media market, tech support, warrant, fraudulent overpayment and investment scams.

As we progress into 2025, we encourage all residents to continue to practice situational awareness, report suspicious activity to our department, and follow the rules of the road. These habits, in conjunction with proven crime prevention techniques like diligently locking your homes and vehicles, will help us make Naperville a safer community and a tougher target for crime.
