

## **Shop the 34th Annual Arbor Day Tree Sale**

Beautify your yard and make a sustainable choice — shop Naperville's annual Arbor Day Tree Sale. The online sale begins at 8 a.m. on Monday, March 17, and closes at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, April 16, or when all trees are sold, whichever comes first. A drive-thru tree pickup will take place from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, April 19, at the Public Works Service Center, 180 Fort Hill Dr.

#### March 17: Yard Waste Collection Begins

Yard waste collection resumes on March 17 and continues through mid-December. To participate in the program, place grass, weeds, small branches, twigs, leaves and other landscape waste into a 32-gallon paper yard waste bag.

Include a yard waste sticker on each bag or bundle placed at the curb for collection. Yard waste stickers can be purchased at the Finance Department at the Naperville Municipal Center, 400 S. Eagle St.

## **Sharps Disposal Program Returns in 2025**

The Sharps Disposal Program is a free and convenient way for Naperville residents to dispose of used medical needles and syringes. These items, known as sharps, can pose a serious health risk if not disposed of properly. The program will run through July I and is open to all Naperville residents. To participate:

- **1.Pick up a free sharps container:** Visit the Naperville Fire Department Administration Center, 1380 Aurora Ave., from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Thursday, to secure a container. One container per person, please.
- **2. Safely store your sharps:** The quart-sized Stericycle containers hold about 36 one-cc syringes, the most common size. Always insert sharps point-first and secure the lid tightly.
- **3.Drop off your sharps:** Take your sealed container to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility, located at 156 Fort Hill Dri. between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. No appointment is required.

Naperville's Household Hazardous Waste Facility is available to all Illinois residents at no charge. The facility accepts various household waste, including pesticides, oil-based paint, fire extinguishers, household cleaners and more. Items can be dropped off from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. No appointment is necessary. For a full list of accepted items, visit naperville.il.us/hhw.

# **Register for Spring Smart Driver Session**

There's still time to register for "Smart Driver," a program developed for drivers ages 50 and older, offered by the Naperville Police Department in partnership with the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP). The class covers local traffic hazards, driving strategies for mature drivers, common crash situations and how to avoid them, a Rules of the Road update and more.

Classes are scheduled for 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 19, and Thursday, March 20, at the Naperville Police Department, 1350 Aurora Ave.

## Safer Naper: Scam Awareness

Every year, millions of people fall victim to various types of scams, losing billions of dollars to criminals. According to Naperville Police, Naperville residents ranging in age from 15 to 91 reported losing nearly \$5.5 million to scams in 2024. The most common scams reported locally were tech support, online resale commerce (e.g., Facebook Marketplace), fake warrants, phishing and investment scams.

Scammers are always changing their tactics and looking for new victims. However, while scams can take many forms, there are red flags that can help alert you.

This month, the Naperville Police Department aims to make Naperville "A Safer Naper" by educating residents about the warning signs of scams and how to avoid falling for them.

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), here are four common signs of a scam:

## **Drone Usage for Electric Utility Inspections**

Beginning in February, residents can expect to see drone activity throughout the area as the City's Electric Utility plans to use drones as part of their ongoing inspections.

A drone is a small, uncrewed aircraft that is guided by remote control and makes a low, continuous humming sound. Drones can be a helpful tool for visual inspections to determine the overall health of electrical equipment, transformers and cables. The aerial views help identify which areas might require attention first, if there are any obstructions (e.g., trees or fences) and enhance the inspection evaluation process.
