

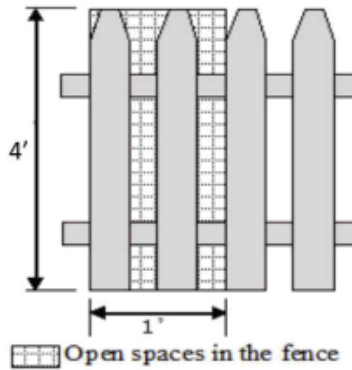

## Fence Material & Style Guide

### Open Style Definition\*



\*See page 2 to see more information on open style fences

Figure 1, Open Fence Example: For a 4' tall open fence, the open spaces in the fence shall include at least 30% or 1.2 sq. feet per one linear foot in length.

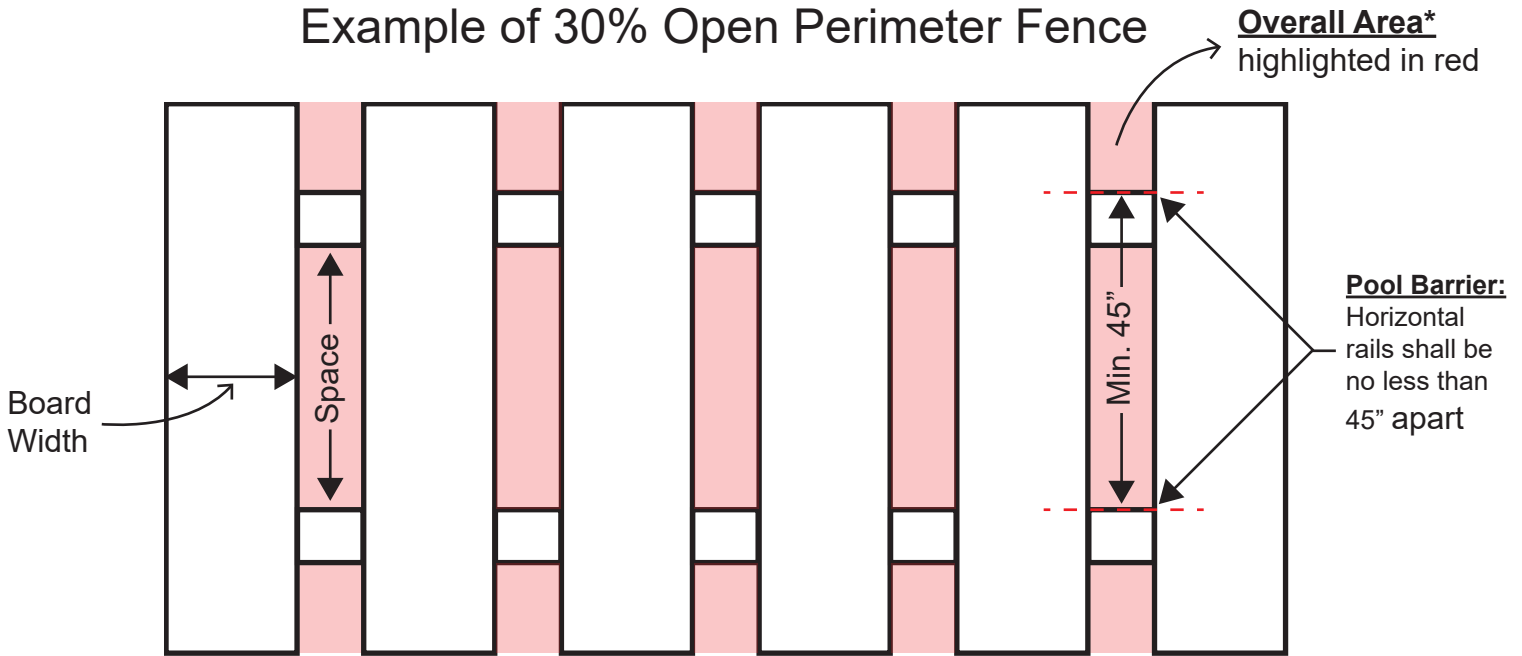

## Fence Material & Style Guide

### Example of 30% Open Perimeter Fence



\*30% open calculated by **OVERALL AREA**, not 30% of board width

**Note:** Fence, semi-open, requires minimum 30% to be open (unobstructed to light and air) when viewed perpendicular (at a right angle) to plane of fence. Board-to-Board and Shadow Box fences DO NOT meet these requirements.

Actual Board Width**	Minimum Space
1-1/2"	3/4"
2-1/2"	1"
3"	1-1/4"
3-1/2"	1-1/2"
4"	1-3/4"
5-1/2"	2-3/8"
6"	2-5/8"

\*\*Verify actual board width for your project and adjust spacing as required to meet minimum requirements.



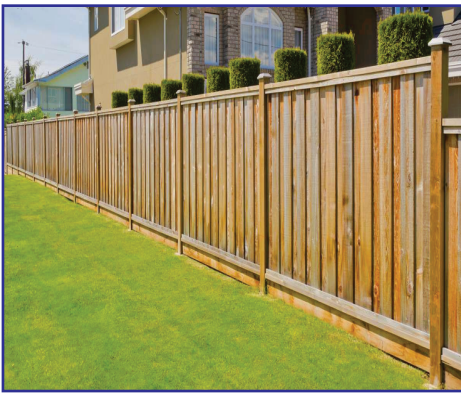

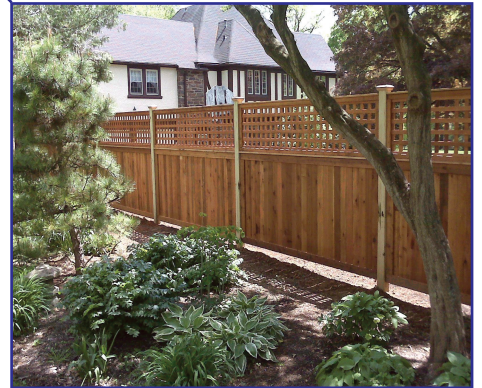
