Naperville owns its electric utility



Naperville has owned its Electric Utility since 1899, celebrating 125 years of reliability and continuous improvement, bringing power to more than 62,000 customers each month.

Features of your locally-controlled utility:

124,729,677 kilowatt hours of electricity were purchased in June 2024.

Naperville buys its electricity through the Illinois Municipal Electric Agency (IMEA).

95% of Naperville's electric infrastructure is underground.

This increases reliability because it is less prone to weather and other damage versus overhead.

Naperville residents enjoy competitive electric rates.

Naperville's Electric Utility is at the forefront of new technologies designed to keep the power on and to respond to outages more quickly.



Shedding some light on reliability

Naperville recorded 23 outages from January 2024 to March 2024. The breakdown of causes are:

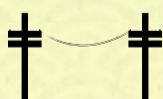

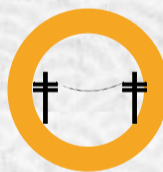


Overhead
