106,761,299 kilowatt hours of electricity were purchased in September 2024.

Naperville buys its electricity through the Illinois Municipal Electric Agency (IMEA).

95% of Naperville's electric infrastructure is underground.

This increases reliability because it is less prone to weather and other damage versus overhead.
